In the Fall of 2021, The Homer and Mildred Scott Foundation purchased a 228 acre property that had previously been utilized as a private youth reform school. The site is just over three miles from downtown Sheridan, WY with sweeping mountain vista views, incredible river frontage, multitudes of wildlife habitat and a football field, gymnasium, and several dormitories. One of the oldest registered subdivision sites in Sheridan County, the history of this location continues to unfold. It is quite a unique property that the Foundation aims to rehabilitate and make available for community access in promoting outdoor educational opportunities.

On site there are diverse prospects for activities including: dedicated agricultural and upland rangeland, a historic dairy barn, healthy

riparian habitat, stream fishing, and ample wildlife viewing opportunities.

Campers will stay in on of the renovated dormitories just feet from Big Goose Creek and with close access to rangeland.

The Homer and Mildred Scott Foundation works to strengthen the lives of people who in turn make our community a great place to live. With an emphasis on youth education and character building programming, the Bridges West property is a true asset in cultivating future leaders, valuing and stewarding the open spaces of Wyoming.

On or before June 2- \$240.00 After June 3 – June 20- \$275.00



- ♦ Treats & snacks (if you want)

Camp Rules:

No smoking or chewing tobacco products, or alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, firearms or fireworks. Throwing objects that may cause bodily harm to another camper is strictly prohibited. Due to intense activities no pets will be allowed. Any personal vehicles will remain in designated parking areas. Camp curfew is 10:30 pm each night. Each group of campers is responsible for ensuring there is at least one adult chaperone per group for the entire duration of the camp. Respect for adult supervision is expected. All campers are to remain at camp for the duration of WyRED and may only leave when given permission by directors. If rules are violated campers will contact parents/ guardians for immediate dismissal. Successful learning and camping will be achieved if all rules are followed and order maintained. These rules are in place for your protection and comply with public safety standards.






Competition Rules & Guidelines:

- 1. Teams will consist of four members at a maximum.
- 2. Team points will be scored from the high three members' individual scores.
- 3. FFA Chapters may enter more than one team.
- 4. The range plant identification, site determinations, range management problem, and questions are the contest scores used to determine team scores.
- 5. FFA team members must be at least 14 yrs. And no more than 18 yrs. by competition date. 2023 high school graduates are eligible.
- 6. FFA team members must be from the same chapter.
- 7. 4-H team members must be from the same state.
- 8. Team members must be designated at the beginning of practice on Wednesday, June 28, 2023.




WyRED 2023 Participant Agreement

Sheridan County Conservation District

Sheridan is on the eastern slope of the Bighorn mountains in northern Wyoming. The average precipitation is 15-19" and the month with the highest rainfall is May. Sheridan County is very diverse ranging from the top of the Bighorn mountains on the western side to the Powder River basin on the eastern side.

Sheridan County has a rich history of Native Americans, pioneers, coal mines, dude ranches, polo horses, ranching and tourism.

Sheridan County Conservation District's function is to focus and coordinate technical, educational, and financial resources to meet the needs of the local land user. One of the ways in which Districts accomplish this is through a unique partnership with the NRCS. The Conservation District coordinates the activities of the NRCS, along with other agencies and groups, in ways that will fit local needs.

In a survey conducted by the SCCD in 2001, over 60% of the respondents ranked water resource concerns in the top five. As a result, SCCD spends a large amount of time on these issues. The Tongue River and Goose Creek watershed efforts have identified water quality concerns on the watersheds and provided means for making improvements. SCCD facilitates local watershed planning efforts and administers a local cost-share assistance program for improvements to Animal Feeding Operations and septic systems, as well as work on streambank/channel restoration projects.

While the major part of the local program in Sheridan County consists of providing technical and financial assistance for water resource improvement projects, the SCCD/NRCS partnership recognizes that natural resource education is a necessary component of any conservation program.

Sheridan County Conservation District plays a vital role in facilitating projects that improve the natural resources of the county.

WY SRM



The Society for Range Management (SRM) was founded in 1948 as an international society. As the parent society grew, states started to develop local "chapters". In 1973, Wyoming formed an official corporation/non-profit organization recognized as Wyoming Section, Society for Range Management. The Society as a whole is a professional organization composed of individuals with common interest in the study, management and rational use of rangeland and related ecosystems. The Society's objectives are:

- to properly take care of the basic rangeland resources of soil, plants and water;
- ♦ to develop an understanding of range ecosystems and of the principles applicable to the management of range resources;
- to assist all who work with range resources to keep abreast of new findings and techniques in the science and art of range management;
- to improve the effectiveness of range management to obtain from range resources to products and values necessary for man's welfare
- to create a public appreciation of economic and social benefits to be obtained from the range environment;
- ⋄ to promote professional development of its members.
