PURPOSE

This committee is responsible in the organization and implementation of Wyoming Youth Range Camp. It is to provide information in the art, science and management of the rangeland resource to Wyoming young people.

STRUCTURE

The committee is made up of a Chair that is appointed by the SRM President. Committee members are as follows:

The committee members may or may not be a member of SRM. The committee is a total of six persons. At minimum, persons on the committee must have at least one person from the Extension Service, University of Wyoming, federal, agency, Conservation District and two at-large, can be any profession. Committee members may be volunteer or appointed via the President and/or Chair. The Chair of the committee sits on the Youth Activities Committee as a member/coordinator.

FUNCTION

Duties of the Committee:

1. Organize and coordinate the Wyoming Youth Range Camp.
2. Encourage and promote Wyoming's youth to attend the Camp.
3. Review rules, program and chaperones of each year's Camp.
4. Promote use of all rangeland activities through the Youth Camp.
5. To see that the Camp is carried out sound and safe and as an informational activity each year.

Specific Positions:

Chair--To coordinate the committee in seeing that all activities and functions of Range Camp are carried out. To assist and review all committee recommendations. To report to the Youth Activities Chair and the Section Council of recommendations and activities of the Wyoming Youth Range Camp.

Program Director--To coordinate the instructors, program, and development of agenda of the Wyoming Youth Range Camp. To obtain necessary materials such as plant lists, quizzes, plant presses, etc. for the function of Camp.

Chaperone/Activities Coordinator--This position requires the person line up to 6 chaperones of which 3 are male and 3 female each year. This person, also, sees that activity such as volleyball; horseshoes, games, videos and campfires are carried out for the students. When chaperones are selected these persons will work with the coordinator on up coming years activities.

Members--These persons are support personnel and assist the rest of the committees in development of the program and/or activities. These persons may be asked to assist in functions of the committee such as mailings, review of rules, assist in chaperone locating, etc.
